Snow Removal

Winter weather in Toledo can change quickly, and our top priority is keeping residents safe as they travel. The City's snow and ice response is built around one clear goal: keep the busiest and most essential roads open first, then move into neighborhoods as conditions allow.

Where We Plow First

With hundreds of lane miles to maintain, Toledo clears streets based on traffic volume and community need:

- **Phase 1:** Major roads carrying more than 7,500 vehicles per day, plus access to hospitals, fire stations, and downtown transit routes.
- Phase 2: Roads with 2,500-7,500 vehicles per day, including TARTA bus routes.
- Phase 3: Key connectors to main roads; streets near schools, churches, hospitals, funeral homes, major employers, and other high-use areas.
- Phase 4 (Residential Streets): These are plowed only when we receive more than 3 inches of snowfall.

You can track plows during active events using Toledo's real-time plow map at **toledo.oh.gov/plows.**

Parking Bans

In severe weather, the Safety Director may issue a parking ban on designated snow emergency routes to allow plows to clear curb-to-curb. Vehicles parked on these routes may be ticketed or towed.

Sidewalk Safety

Residents and businesses must keep sidewalks clear for pedestrians, and snow may not be pushed into the street.

VOLUNTEER AS A SNOW ANGEL

Engage Toledo to register for assistance.

The Snow Angels Shoveling Program will work to pair you with a nearby neighbor. We will be in touch when you have been matched with a neighbor in need.

Things to know before you volunteer:

- → Volunteer groups are welcome
- Volunteers are expected to provide their own snow removal tools
- → Please help out your neighbor as soon as you are able and within 24-hours of the end of a snow event.

REQUEST A SNOW ANGEL

This program helps older residents and residents with disabilities. The following guidelines are needed to become a participant:

- → 60+ years old, or
- → disabled, and
- paying for snow removal is a financial burden
- There is nobody else in the household who can remove snow

Things to know before you request help:

- You are not guaranteed assistance. Service depends on if there's a Snow Angel who has signed up near you.
- → If you are matched with a volunteer, we will notify you by email or phone call.
- Please give your volunteer a reasonable amount of time to assist you we recommend allowing 24-hours after a snow event concludes.

READY TO VOLUNTEER?

There is always a need for volunteers of all shapes, sizes, and capacities. From students who need volunteer hours to snow removal companies, all are welcome to volunteer!

Employee Spotlight: Class I & II Water Distribution Employees

Dedication on display;
Water Distribution employees
reach new heights with certifications

A few years ago, three or four licenses were framed and hung on the wall in the Water Distribution Division's office. Today, the wall is nearly covered with Ohio EPA certifications recognizing advanced skills in operating and maintaining public water and wastewater systems, a visible sign of the team's dedication and skill in keeping the city's water system running reliably.

"I think it's great to get people certified and licensed in the state of Ohio." Todd Saums, commissioner of Water Distribution, said.

Employees can earn a Class I license after one year of water distribution experience and a Class II after two years, marking higher technical proficiency. Classes and study materials are provided by the Operator Training Committee of Ohio, and employees can continue advancing with higher-level exams.

The result is a more capable team and better service for the community. "It gives our residents confidence that Toledo has qualified, skilled people maintaining a system that serves 500,000 people," Saums said.

Structure Concern

We respond to reports of structure concerns on privately-owned property including graffiti, broken down vehicles, or property maintenance concerns.

Hydrant Concern

We respond to reports of hydrant concerns including frozen hydrants, leaking hydrants, or hydrants in need of maintenance or repair.

Blight Concern

We respond to reports of blight concerns, including debris, trash, or illegal dumping on public or abandoned properties.

Water Backup Inside

We respond to reports of flooding or sewer odors in your basement caused by broken or obstructed sewer lines or unusually heavy rainfall.
