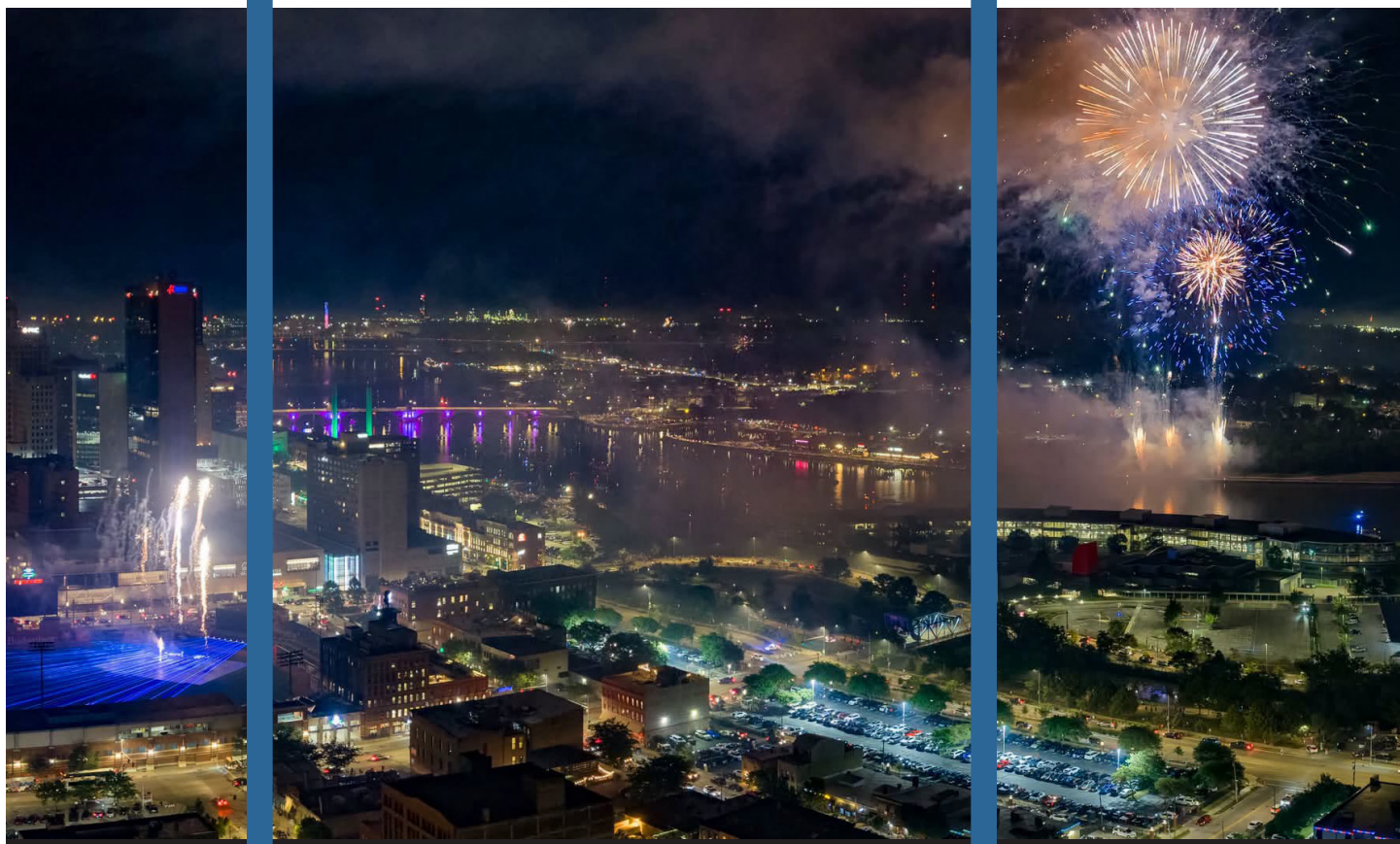

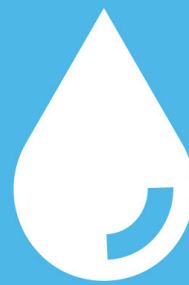

How Water Rates Affect Your Bill

The chart below is based on **4 CCF** water usage (average for a 4 person household).

All customers who fall below the eligible household income can apply for WRAP to receive a **25% discount on their water and sewer volume rate.**

Renters are eligible when their unit has an individual meter - even if the landlord pays the water bill. Complete a landlord-tenant agent authority agreement to be eligible.

BULK COLLECTION GUIDELINES



Bulk will be serviced weekly.

Bulk items will be serviced on the same day as refuse collection.

There is a five-item (5) limit for bulk pick up each week. Each item should weigh no more than 40 lbs.

Bulk only collected at the curb.

- ▶ Wrap old mattresses in plastic for safe and efficient disposal.
- ▶ Yard waste/branches must be cut into 4' lengths and bundled or bagged and less than 40 lbs. Branches should be less than 6' in diameter.
- ▶ All protruding nails and screws must be removed from loose wood or pounded flat. Wood should be less than 4' x 4' and bundled together/bagged and less than 40 lbs.
- ▶ Any other loose materials should be less than 4' x 4' and bundled/bagged and less than 40 lbs. (including clothing, tarps, cardboard or any other miscellaneous items).
- ▶ Rolled rugs and/or carpet must be tied in lengths of 4' or less and weigh no more than 40 lbs.
- ▶ Large appliances - Remove doors and fluids from appliances like refrigerators and washing machines.
- ▶ There must be 6' of clearance on all sides of the pile from personal property (vehicles, mailboxes, etc.)

Residents and homeowners may be charged a fine by not adhering to the proper rules.

Unacceptable Bulk Items

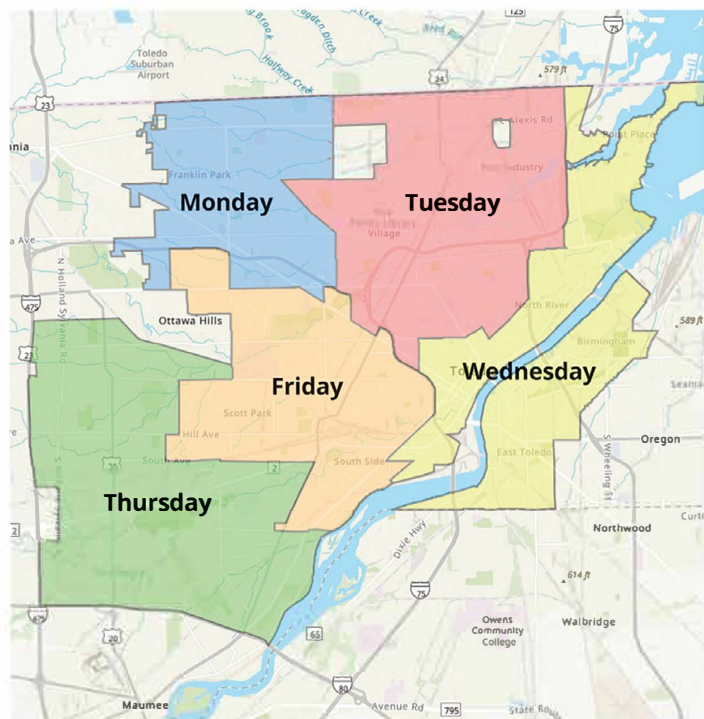
- ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Tires
- ✗ Hazardous waste (oil, paint, chemicals)
- ✗ Commercial building or construction materials (fencing, dry wall, shingles)
- ✗ Major car parts
- ✗ Metal box springs
- ✗ Metal doors
- ✗ Computer monitors

Trash Assistance Program (TAP)

Toledo residents who need help getting their recycling and trash carts to the curb should call Republic Services at **419.936.2511** to request an application. Please note that this program does not include bulk services. The Toledo ADA Assistance Program is a collaborative effort of Republic Services, Lucas County, the City of Toledo and the Toledo/Lucas County Commission on Disabilities.

RE-TREE Toledo is planting thousands of trees where trees are needed most making Toledo healthier and more beautiful for everyone.

Yes, trees are beautiful. They're also powerful. A flourishing tree canopy means healthier air, cooler streets, and cooler neighborhoods. With every new tree, we're creating inviting, enduring spaces where kids can play, neighbors can gather, and families can thrive.



Join the Canopy Crew

Through the Canopy Crew ambassador program, community events, classroom visits and hands-on training, RE-TREE Toledo will inspire the next generation of tree champions where more trees are nurtured, more neighborhoods are transformed and everyone enjoys the shade from the canopy above. Opportunities for Teens

A paid summer workforce development program is available for 56 eligible TPS students from designated areas. How it Works

Demolition Process

Planning

1. Pick the building

We look at the condition of the building and declare it a public nuisance (a danger to people and neighbors).

We send official notices to the owner and give time to respond.

2. Test for safety

We check for asbestos (a harmful material) and other hazards, and we hire licensed professionals to safely remove what they find.

3. Get approvals

We complete a historic building review if needed. We also review for any environmental concerns.

4. Shut off utilities

We make sure gas, water, and electricity are safely shut off before any work starts.

5. Notify neighbors

We tell nearby residents when demolition will happen and how we'll protect them from dust or debris.

Demolishing

6. Control dust

We spray water to keep dust down and protect the air. Neighbors should keep windows shut and stay inside to protect themselves during demolition.

7. Remove all debris

The contractor removes the whole building and all leftover materials—no piles left behind or buried.

8. Clean and restore the land

We fill in the hole and smooth the ground. We add fresh topsoil. We plant grass and white clover to help the soil stay healthy.

9. Check the site

We inspect to make sure the land is clean, safe, and free of dead trees or extra debris.

10. Let the Land Bank know

The Land Bank becomes the owner of vacant lots and works with residents to decide what happens next.
